**Introduction:** The resurrection of Jesus was perplexing and frightening. But it was according to plan. And it makes everything new.

**I) The resurrection actually happened**

Real time and place

Empty tomb

“Not a ghost”

Jesus could do more—but he was no less fully embodied

**II) The resurrection was ‘according to plan’**

**A) Perplexing and frightening**

**B) Not absurd, disconnected or freakish**

*Remember what he said (v 6)*

*Necessary (v 6, 44)*

**III) What does the resurrection mean?**

**A) God has made everything in this world different**

**B) God really loves us**

*He suffered (v 46)*

*To remit sins (v 47)*

**Take Away:** *Repent (v 47)*

**Questions for Reflection this Week**

- 1) Read over Luke 24 and list all the details that underscore that the resurrection of Jesus actually happened in space and time. Why is this important?
- 2) Twice we are told that “it was necessary” for Jesus to suffer and then to rise” (v 6, v 44). Why the necessity?
- 3) Why does Jesus’ resurrection prove and guarantee the end of sin’s power and guilt?
- 4) Does Jesus’ resurrection mean that we should expect not to have any further struggles with sickness, death, or sin? If not, why not?
- 5) What does his resurrection guarantee regarding sin and death in your life?
- 6) How do the suffering and resurrection of Jesus prove that God loves us?
- 7) Do the death and resurrection of Jesus guarantee the end of sin and death for everyone? What, according to Luke 24:27, is the condition required for someone to benefit from Jesus’ work? What, in practical terms does it mean? Have you met the condition?
